PROTECT OUR KEIKI FROM INTERNET PORNOGRAPHY 'SPAMMERS' COME DOWN TO THE CAPITOL TODAY AND SUPPORT OUR KEIKI!

**The bill is being heard TODAY in the Senate Committee on Media, Arts & Technology.
1:30 p.m. in room #225 of the State Capitol.
From there it will move to the Senate Judiciary Committee.**

Parents across the islands are rightly concerned about the very dangerous aspects of internet crimes against children. Law enforcement, schools, community groups, faith-based organizations and parent-teacher alliances warn parents about the dangers posed by perpetrators who use the internet to lure minor children into having sex with them. In fact, there is a whole task force within the Department of the Attorney General devoted to protecting children from internet predators.

A bill is being heard today which establishes a registry of children's electronic contact points to which unsolicited messages (i.e. pornography, illegal or prescription drugs, alcohol, tobacco, gambling, firearms, and fireworks) may not be sent.

ACTION:

1. Contact members of the House Committee on Media, Arts, Science & Technology and urge them to pass SB 2200 (Relating to Child Protection). Ask them to consider a tougher minimum sentence than the 1-year proposed by this legislation. These perpetrators are every parent's nightmare.
