LAWS PROTECTING CHILDREN PASS

CHILD PORNOGRAPHERS TO REGISTER AS SEX OFFENDERS (SB 2842 HD 4)

This bill, supported by Hawaii Family Forum (HFF), requires persons convicted of crimes involving child pornography to register as sex offenders. Thankfully, Governor Lingle signed this bill into law on May 10, 2004 (Act 059). HFF Director of Communications, Eva Andrade, was invited to the signing in the Governor's office.



Attorney General Mark Bennett thanked HFF for its support of the bill and expressed appreciation for community participation. We thank all of you who took the time to contact your legislators on this issue. Your commitment to families made a difference.

SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION (Megan's Amendment) (SB 2843 SD1 HD2)

This measure, also supported by HFF, places a question on the ballot for the November election asking the people of Hawaii to decide on whether or not convicted sex offenders information should be made public. The bill as passed, allows the Legislature to define what sex offenses will require registration. The Governor strongly supported this measure, although she did not have to sign it because it is a Constitutional Amendment.

PAIN PATIENT BILL OF RIGHTS (HB 1839 HD 2 SD 2) This bill gives rights to pain patients and authorizes doctors to prescribe medically necessary doses of controlled substances to treat serious pain.
