# Candidates for United States Congress, Hawaii Governor, Lt. Governor, Hawaii State Senate & Hawaii State House of Representatives

Hawaii Family Forum is a non-partisan, 501(c)(3) organization and does not endorse or oppose any candidate for elected office, whether or not they responded to this survey. We offer this guide to educate the community in Hawaii about the views of the candidates for the office of which they are running.

We understand that many candidates did not respond to the survey, so all links on the electronic PDF version are interactive. The online version will enable you to enlarge the text. Hover over the underlined web addresses and you will be directed to the website. We encourage you to call your candidates at the phone numbers provided and/or visit their campaign websites to find out more information, especially if they did not respond to the survey. Please be courteous when making contact with any candidate for public office.

#### **Keep Your Voter Registration Current**

Ballots are mailed to the mailing address associated with your voter registration. If you move to a new residence, change your mailing address or name, you must update your voter registration. You may check online or contact your County Elections Division to confirm that your registration record is current.

#### Receiving Your Ballot

You will receive a GENERAL election mail ballot packet no later than *October 21, 2022*. Your packet consists of a ballot, ballot secrecy sleeve, and a prepaid postage return ballot envelope.

Voters with special needs may request for an electronic ballot through the Voter Registration Application or by contacting their County Elections Division.

#### **Returning Your Ballot**

You may return your completed ballot by mail or in person at a designated place of deposit within your county. Please keep in mind that ballots must be received by your County Elections Division by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

#### **Tracking Your Ballot**

You may check on the status of your ballot, whether it has been mailed and/or received, by contacting your County Elections Division. Track your ballot at <a href="https://hawaii.ballottrax.net/voter/">https://hawaii.ballottrax.net/voter/</a>

#### **Processing Your Ballot**

Upon receipt of your return envelope, your County Elections Division validates the signature to confirm your identity. After your signature is validated, your ballot will be forwarded to state election officials to be counted.

#### **Voting at a Voter Service Center**

The County Elections Divisions establish voter service centers that will be open 10 days prior and on Election Day. Services include accessible in person voting and same day registration.



					We made huge strides toward helping the middle class and working families by finally making the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) refundable and permanent. In addition, we increased the minimum wage to \$18 per hour by 2028. Further, we tackled the housing crisis by allocating \$5m toward affordable homeownership, \$10m to public housing, \$15 to Ohana Zones, \$23m to housing subsidies for TANF recipients, \$9.8m to teacher housing, over \$600m to DHHL, and many more low-income and affordable housing initiatives. Finally, the legislature passed a bill that provides tax credits to all residents. I will continue to support these types of initiatives.

We also need to balance government funds better by using less funds on projects which will not benefit many people and channel those funds to projects which will help more people. We need efficiency and financial accountability for every government-funded project.

"We electors have an important constitutional power placed in our hands; we have a check upon two branches of the legislature . . . the power I mean of electing at stated periods [each] branch. . . . It becomes necessary to every [citizen] then, to be in some degree a statesman, and to examine and judge for himself of the tendency of political principles and measures. Let us examine, then, with a sober, a manly . . . and a Christian spirit; let us neglect all party [loyalty] and advert to facts; let us believe no man to be infallible or impeccable in government any more than in religion; take no man's word against evidence, nor implicitly adopt the sentiments of others who may be deceived themselves, or may be interested in deceiving us."
