#### Abstract

Hawaii Family Forum is a non-partisan, 501 (c)(3) organization and does not endorse or oppose any candidate for elected office, whether or not they responded to this survey. We offer this guide to educate the community in Hawaii about the views of the candidates for the office of which they are running.

We understand that many candidates did not respond to the survey, so all links on the electronic PDF version are interactive. The online version will enable you to enlarge the text. Hover over the underlined web addresses and you will be directed to the website. We encourage you to call your candidates at the phone numbers provided and/or visit their campaign websites to find out more information, especially if they did not respond to the survey. Please be courteous when making contact with any candidate for public office.


Keep Your Voter Registration Current
Ballots are mailed to the mailing address associated with your voter registration. If you move to a new residence, change your mailing address or name, you must update your voter registration. You may check online or contact your County Elections Division to confirm that your registration record is current.

## Receiving Your Ballot

You will receive a GENERAL election mail ballot packet no later than October 21, 2022 . Your packet consists of a ballot, ballot secrecy sleeve, and a prepaid postage return ballot envelope.

Voters with special needs may request for an electronic ballot through the Voter Registration Application or by contacting their County Elections Division.

Returning Your Ballot
You may return your completed ballot by mail or in person at a designated place of deposit within your county. Please keep in mind that ballots must be received by your County Elections Division by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Tracking Your Ballot
You may check on the status of your ballot, whether it has been mailed and/or received, by contacting your County Elections Division. Track your ballot at https://hawaii.ballottrax.net/voter/

Processing Your Ballot
Upon receipt of your return envelope, your County Elections Division validates the signature to confirm your identity. After your signature is validated, your ballot will be forwarded to state election officials to be counted.

Voting at a Voter Service Center
The County Elections Divisions establish voter service centers that will be open 10 days prior and on Election Day. Services include accessible in person voting and same day registration.

This is a problem that needs to be addressed now. The people of Hawai'i were already struggling before inflation made our state even more expensive. We need to cut our cost of living by cutting the fees, taxes, and regulations that impact the cost of food, housing, and transportation. One thing that we could do that would have an immediate effect, especially on middle and low income families, is to eliminate the general excise tax on food and medicine. Hawai'i is one of only 13 states that tax groceries, and one of only 7 states that tax groceries at the same percentage as other goods. We have been taxing our poorest neighbors further and further into debt, which has contributed to Hawai'i being one of the worst states for homelessness.


We want to support small businesses by eliminating the red tape and excessive policies involved in making Hawaii the hardest place to start a small business. We also want to revisit certain taxes like the GET and income tax to see what can be done about implementing a simple low flat tax. We would also take a look at our land use policies which have a "double layer" at the state and county level. We need to eliminate one layer, preferably the state level and let the county run it being that there's too much bureaucracy involved in the land use policies. These are just a few things we would look at working with the legislature to help the economy, cost of living, etc. In the end we believe there's a difference between knowing and doing. Those in office know quite a bit but when it comes to doing there's definitely a lack of this. Longevity does not equal productivity. It's not about duration but donation and those in office, no matter how long they've been there, have not produced at a level that the people of Hawaii deserve. We made huge strides toward helping the middle class and working families by finally making the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) refundable and permanent. In addition, we increased the minimum wage to $\$ 18$ per hour by 2028.
